The Life of John Morris

John Morris was a member of the founding Board of Directors which established the corporation known as Camp Wyoming in 1960. He was instrumental in developing and supporting the ministry at Camp Wyoming since its inception and until his death on December 18, 2007. Camp Wyoming expresses its appreciation for the energy and creativity that John brought to the organization.

John was born on February 12, 1916 in Wapello, Iowa. He later graduated from Wapello High School and then Iowa State University. He served in the United State Navy during World War II. John was united in marriage to Ruth Howie on July 5, 1939 in Monticello, Iowa.

He spent his life as an agriculturist, writer, speaker, photographer, and traveler. John served on the Iowa State University Extension Service, Soil Conservation Service of the US Dept. of Agriculture, and operated his own farms. John served on many advisory positions, including at the President and Cabinet level in the United States and abroad; where he gained experience in most areas of the world. John gave 15 young Japanese men each one year of his life to teach them agricultural and management skills on his farm when Japan was a third world country.

John was a member of the Washington United Presbyterian Church where he served as an elder. He served on many Presbytery and Synod groups, especially the food and hunger mission in the United States and abroad. John has written and spoken extensively, promoting education, but has especially appreciated his family and friends.

Prior to his death, John and Ruth made a contribution to the Camp in the amount of \$10,000 towards the New Welcome Center. Memorials in his name have been directed towards this same project. John's work, both personally and professionally, symbolized the concrete living of his baptism. As written in James 2:18 "...Show me your faith without deeds, and I will show you my faith by what I do." He lived his life to empower others and in turn to serve the glory of God. Thank you, John. We will miss you.

Wintertainment Review

Campers and staff had a blast this year at Wintertainment. God provided a beautiful snowfall on the first day that offered a vivid Winter Wonderland image.

The Theme for Wintertainment was "Open the Eyes of My Heart." For campers to truly see God in every person, they learned to understand and appreciate the differences in each of us. Volunteer Spotlight ~ Rev. Al Polito Jr.



Rev. Al Polito Jr. is the pastor at the First Presbyterian Church in Monticello, Iowa. He and his wife Linda have been married for 27 years. They have two children. Their son Josiah graduated in May 2007 from Wartburg College with a Physical Therapy degree. Josiah is employed at Allen Memorial Hospital in Waterloo. Their daughter, Blythe is a 3rd year student at Wartburg College majoring in Elementary Education.

Al was born in Chicago, Illinois. At 9 years of age his family moved to Des Moines, then two years later moved to Hartford, Iowa. Al attended the Carlisle school district and graduated from Carlisle High School in 1975. He then attended Buena Vista College in Storm Lake, Iowa graduating in 1980 with a Physical Education degree and a minor in Religion and Recreation.

Al and Linda met while participating in church camp ministry at Knox Knolls Camp in central Iowa. It is at this camp where Al first heard of Camp Wyoming when a friend recruited him to spend a week at Camp Wyoming as a male counselor. Al and Linda married in 1980, moved to Maquoketa, Iowa where Linda was a teacher and Al enrolled at the Dubuque Seminary School. Al graduated in 1984 and the family moved to Dexter, Iowa where Al served two churches for 6 years.

In 1990 Al accepted a call at the First Presbyterian Church in Monticello, Iowa. Shortly after starting in Monticello, Al attended a retreat at Camp Wyoming for new pastors. He and Linda both attended the You & Me camps with Josiah and Blythe. Most recently Al and Linda participated in the Pastor in Residence program by spending a week onsite at Camp Wyoming.

Each fall First Presbyterian holds a Camp & Conference dinner in order to raise the funds needed to send their youth to camp. The church pays 100% of the camp fee. Appreciative youth and their families rally together and take care of setting up, working the dinner and cleaning up afterwards. Several other fundraisers are held throughout the year.

In his spare time, Al likes to spend time outdoors walking and hiking, and has recently enjoyed Boundary Water canoe trips with his son and friends. The last movie Al has seen was a collection entitled, Planet Earth. Al's favorite treat is ice cream. Family and friends bring Al the greatest joys in life.

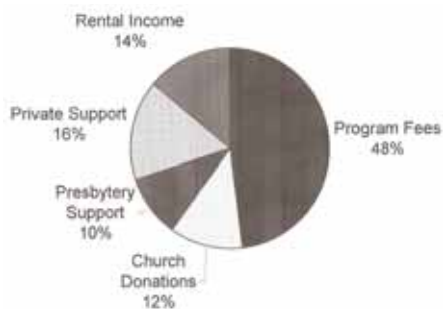

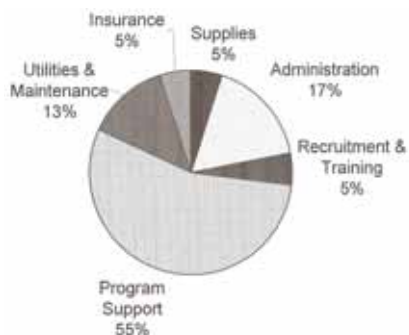
